These are followed by other flowering trees and bushes including lilacs, flowering Hawthorn, roses and many others. Three new trees have been added to our landscape this summer, a lilac tree and two Hawthorn trees. The BOD, with the help of Saddle Peak Properties and an arborist, is developing a



landscape plan to ensure Woodbrook remains the beautiful place it is.

Summer is a busy time around Woodbrook. The lawn crew arrives to mow the lawn, trees, hedges and bushes are trimmed, the irrigation system is turned on, fertilizer is applied. This summer has been a challenge weather-wise, first too much rain then hot and dry. Saddle Peak is working to maintain our aging irrigation system and stay within the water restrictions imposed by the City of Bozeman. Even though our grounds are irrigated by Woodbrook wells, the BOD wants to cooperate with the city of Bozeman and our neighbors. Don't forget, Woodbrook's irrigation system is on wells but the faucets attached to our units is city water, therefore the city restrictions are in force.

Dryer Vents & Chimney Cleaning

The Dryer Vents and Chimneys will be inspected starting after September 15th. Owners will be billed \$175/dryer vent. Chimney Inspections will be paid for by the association. If your chimney needs to be cleaned, this will be billed on a per unit basis. If you have already cleaned your dryer vent and/or chimney in the last 12 months, please provide a receipt to Saddle Peak Properties, LLC no later than September 15.

Raccoons - We got 'em!

This summer has seen an increase in raccoon activity in Woodbrook. It was reported at the July 19 Quarterly meeting 3 raccoons had been trapped. Since then another 6 have been trapped. Traps were set behind Units 19 and 25 Hoffman Drive. The raccoons first made their presence known when for several nights one tried to get into a unit through the skylight. The owner, awakened by noises coming from the skylight, shone a flashlight on the skylight revealing the raccoon on the roof trying to get in. Other residents report hearing thumping or running noises in the night coming from their roofs. Raccoons gain access to roofs by climbing nearby trees. Woodbrook units close to Matthew Bird Creek are particularly vulnerable as raccoons travel along waterways. Unit owners who see or hear raccoons, please contact Saddle Peak Properties. While raccoons may look cute these critters are aggressive and destructive. Raccoons eat everything from gardens to garbage. They fight pets and spread diseases such as distemper and rabies. They can tear vents off roofs, gain entry through chimneys, turn attics into dens and decks into raccoon bathrooms. While there are many food sources for raccoons in our neighborhood we can all do our little bit by storing our garbage bins in the garage until garbage day and limiting food sources as much as possible for raccoons.

Update on Tree Trimming and Tree Removal

Two days in July the crew from Bozeman Arborcare trimmed trees, removed dead branches and trimmed many of the cotoneaster hedges on the Woodbrook grounds. The past several winters have been hard on our trees with a lot of broken branches. There is still trimming to trees and shrubs that needs to be done. Bozeman Arborcare will be back in the fall to tackle more trimming and removal, in the meantime a crew of two has been busy trimming bushes and hedges mainly on the east side of the creek. Over the next few weeks progress will be made on the entire grounds. Thanks to Jeanne Nash and Grace Lloyd for watering the new Hawthorn trees by their units.
